Xpress Wellness Announces Urgent Care Medical Services Coming to Elk City and Surrounding Communities

ELK CITY, OK -- Xpress Wellness announced plans to build a state-of-the art urgent care medical center in Elk City, Oklahoma. The new urgent care medical center will be located at 411 W. 3rd Street and will begin seeing patients in April 2014.

Xpress Wellness is an urgent care and occupational medicine provider that treats non-life threatening illnesses and injuries on a walk-in basis (no appointment needed). Xpress Wellness will be open 7 days a week with extended evening hours and weekends. Hours of operation will be 9am – 9pm Monday through Saturday and 1pm – 7pm Sunday.

The urgent care center will consist of 8 private exam rooms including procedure room, triage room and ability to provide women's health care. The center will have computerized radiology services, lab services, diagnostic testing and EKG onsite. Comprehensive medical care services will be provided including care for common illnesses, sprains, strains, lacerations, flu, allergies, infections, pediatric care, vaccinations, sports physicals, work physicals, drug screens, and work-related injuries. The waiting area will be comfortable with flat screen TVs and free Wi-Fi. Patients will have the capability to request services and complete patient registration online in the convenience of their own home. Insurance and other forms of payment will be accepted.

Xpress Wellness is an Oklahoma-based private company led by Dr. Scott Williams. Dr. Williams graduated from Oklahoma State University of Osteopathic Medicine and is board certified through American Board of Osteopathic Family Practitioners. He is Chief of Staff for Great Plains Regional Medical Center. He has been in family practice in Elk City since 1999 with special interests in obstetrics and sports medicine. Xpress Wellness plans to open its first 10 urgent care medical centers by the end of 2016.
